Externally, scaffolding is being dismantled to reveal the striking terracotta render, soon to be clad with panels to give the building its final layer. The pyramid roofs are complete topped with 'Monodraught' systems allowing the building to breathe naturally throughout the seasons.

Fact of the month: The cladding on the Burlington building doesn't just cover the external walls, but the windows too. Why, you may ask? The cladding covers the windows on the south elevation specifically to shield the building and its impressive atrium space from solar gain leading to overheating. So, it's not JUST a pretty facel
